
Jesus has worked to produce peace between God and us, and now he wants us to produce peace between us and those around us and in our lives.

BIBLE TALK



Jesus said: Blessed are the peacemakers . . ." What did Jesus mean when he said, "Blessed"?

School Graduation Ceremonies have been banned by the NSW government to try and stop the spread of the Coronavirus?

What happens at a Graduation Ceremony?

Graduation ceremonies shows what our school community values and honours.

Jesus is telling us what God's community must value and honour, because these are the qualities

that God publicly honours and congratulates, that he admires and approves?

In his sermon, Jesus lists 8 qualities or behaviours that God admires and approves.

Can I have someone volunteer to write these neatly on our whiteboard?

What are the 8 qualities that God admires and awards?

- Blessed are the poor in spirit being humble because you realise you are not God and you are not the centre of the universe but just one very needy creature among billions of need creatures
- Blessed are those who mourn feeling deeply for others and ourselves, the pain of living in a broken world, and having to struggle with evil around us and in us
- 3. **Blessed are the meek** the gentleness that comes from placing your trust in the power of God rather than your own power, as you do what is good and right in the face of what is bad and wrong
- 4. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness this is a longing for and making it your mission to work with Jesus in restoring the kingdom of God in your world, by living with others according to God's values and practicing Jesus' instructions and directions
- 5. Blessed are the merciful Jesus' disciples must be very generous with forgiveness, we must be giving out lots of forgiveness, ready and willing to forgive as much as we can and as often as we can, because that's what we want from God
- 6. Blessed are the pure in heart this is having a heart towards God and others that is clean, that is, it is not a heart that is polluted with good and bad motives, but is genuine and sincere towards God and people. It is the opposite of being a manipulator or being deceptive and untrustworthy
- 7. Blessed are the peacemakers this about being committed to removing hurt and conflict and restoring harmony and calm in

relationships. To peacemakers, healthy and happy relationships matter.

The 8 Qualities of the Blessed (The Beatitudes)

1. Blessed are the poor in spirit (humble)

2. Blessed are those who mourn

3. Blessed are the meek (gentle)

4. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness

Let's look at what Jesus teaches elsewhere that peacemakers care about repairing relationships, removing hurt and conflict and restoring harmony and calm - **Matthew 18:15-20**

Matthew~18:15-17 $^{15}\,^{\prime\prime}$ If another believer sins against you, go privately and point out the offense. If the other person listens and confesses it, you have won that person back.

¹⁶ But if you are unsuccessful, take one or two others with you and go back again, so that everything you say may be confirmed by two or three witnesses.

¹⁷ If the person still refuses to listen, take your case to the church. Then if he or she won't accept the church's decision, treat that person as a pagan or a corrupt tax collector.

What this tells us is that the church family values relationships a lot because we don't want to just look like a good and happy family. We want to be a good and happy family.

The person being punished here is a person who has demonstrated clearly to the church family that he or she doesn't care about their relationship with others, whether they injure or damage another person doesn't matter to them.

Peacemaking means that we are all sincere about having relationships that are strong and healthy, and that we are actually loving God and loving one another not just pretending to or covering up a lot of hurt, hatred and conflict.

Blessed are the persecuted because of righteousness and because of Jesus – The 8 Qualities of the Blessed (The Beatitudes)

- Blessed are the poor in spirit (humble)
- Blessed are those who mourn
- 3. Blessed are the meek (gentle)
- Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness
- 5. Blessed are the merciful
 - 6. Blessed are the pure in heart
- 7. Blessed are the peacemakers
- 8. Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, because of following Jesus

Sometimes peacemaking is very difficult, and it can even get you in trouble, or stir up more hurt and conflict with others who want power and control not healthy friendships.

But cheer up.



God is proud of peacemakers, and he is so proud of them that he tells everyone – these are my children.
